


It sounds funny, but we wouldn't conceive of stopping learning at the age of 13. Middle school is still a time when we have many skills to develop beyond just mathematics and writing. We still need to learn how to process information, not allow ourselves to be overwhelmed as our bodies are still developing and hopefully allow a sense of self to mature. Instead, after bar/bat mitzvah celebrations are completed many of us stop studying Judaism.



Whether as a child we were given the option to continue or not, many of the American Jewish community stopped or stopped actively engaging with our faith. For many people this decision to stop studying Judaism was replaced with the drive to become accomplished in a career and therefore the need to master medicine, law, business or a different area of study before Judaism.

Anecdotally many professionals in the Jewish community believe that knowledge of our ancient sacred texts, understanding of modern Israeli history and politics, and the ability to feel comfortable in a variety of Jewish settings is at an all-time low. I would like to offer several reasons why Jewish Literacy is important.

- 1. Jewish Illiteracy ensures that the practice of various traditions, celebrations of holidays and the opportunities to be challenged by our traditions are almost without meaning.
- 2. Jewish Literacy helps families practice and celebrate Shabbat at home in an authentically Reform fashion; validating what we believe and practice in the synagogue so as to guarantee that the two are inherently connected.
- 3. Jewish Literacy helps individuals make meaning in their lives so through life's highs and lows, we can feel more deeply connected to those around us.
- 4. Jewish Literacy helps us appreciate our culture beyond "lox and bagels" or "they tried to kill us, we survived, let's eat." There is a depth of humor, literature, art and music. We have modern American composers crafting songs that touch our hearts with images and sound that speak to societal needs today.



As we enter into the holiday season, I would love to see you at Temple for our various programs including Cantor Barry's installation and the Shabbat dinner on the Shabbat during Chanukah. I would encourage you to review our website for classes that we are offering from our Saturday morning Torah study, Sunday morning's 12 Jewish Questions, Wisdom, The Making of Modern Israel (taught by Harvey Leven and sponsored in part by Dr. Kanter), or my book club. We will have two Jewish scholars visit the congregation - Rabbi Evan Moffic in January and Rabbi Barry Block this spring (to share the book he edited and I contributed to). We will have a class offered by Rabbi Sylvin Wolf and a class on Jewish music taught by Cantor Barry.

For our youth, we have a variety of options through TIR and youth programming intended to both intellectually challenge and develop social connections. I encourage you to please check out all that we are offering!

May you be blessed with a sweet, healthy and happy holiday season! Happy Chanukah from Rabbi, Aiden, David, and Daniel Bahar!!!



- Continue to evaluate and improve our sound system to make the services and social events held in the sanctuary, chapel and social halls more enjoyable venues.



The Museum of the Southern Jewish Experience to Open in New Orleans Next Year

The American Tapestry is woven of many threads. A nation of immigrants, America's promise has brought Jews to its shores for almost 400 years. Like others, Jews came seeking religious freedom, economic opportunity, even adventure, in the New World. Most came through and settled in the big northeastern port cities, where they found support and fellowship, their numbers being sufficient to form strong communities. But what of Jews who came to the South through Savannah, Charleston, Mobile, New Orleans, Galveston? What of the Jews who moved inland, peddling their wares from farm to farm through the Appalachian Piedmont and the Mississippi Delta? What of their children, grandchildren? What challenges did each generation face? And how did each strengthen America's tapestry while maintaining their Judaism? Their stories are our stories and serve as powerful reminders of the immigrant experience that has so enriched our past and holds so much possibility for the future.

The Museum of the Southern Jewish Experience will open in New Orleans next year, exploring the many ways that Jews in the American South influenced and were influenced by the distinct cultural heritage of their new homes. Through its exhibits, collections and programs focused on the unique and remarkable history of Southern Jews, the MSJE will encourage new understanding and appreciation for identity, diversity, and acceptance. This is and isn't the museum that was located at Henry S. Jacobs Camp, in Utica, MS. The original MSJE served as a repository for artifacts and Judaica from disappearing small-town Southern Jewish communities, mostly in Mississippi, Louisiana, and Arkansas. It was closed in 2012 and a new location was sought, one that would ensure that the Museum would be fully accessible to the general public—Jewish and non-Jewish alike. And with its expanded mission to explore the wider history of Southern Jews, MSJE now includes Jewish history from Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia. Today, the Museum is poised to become a popular tourist destination, an important educational facility, a heartfelt testament to the legacy of Judaism in the South, and a vibrant center for cultural dialogue and discovery.



Political Gridlock in Israel and America: How Our Systems Work—and Don't Work

Dr. David Schwam-Baird teaches courses on International Politics, with an emphasis on the Middle East, Latin America, and Europe. He also teaches courses on Political Philosophy. He serves as the Director of the Master of Arts in International Affairs program. Dr. Schwam-Baird has lived and traveled extensively abroad, including Israel, France, and Belgium. He was taught at a number of universities internally. He has lived in Jacksonville, FL and taught at UNF since 1994. His wife, Shira, is a Professor of French at UNF.

Israelis have had two national elections in 2019, and yet they can't seem to come up with a team to lead the country. Will the gridlock continue so that they will have to go for a third round of elections? Why haven't the elections led to the formation of a government? The Israeli parliamentary system works very dirently than our American system. Yet we can also get stuck in gridlock, with a Republican Senate and a Democratic House of Representatives, for example. Dr. Schwam-Baird, a political science professor at UNF, will explain the Israeli and American systems, and compare their advantages and disadvantages.


