

Dear Friends,

If you are here on a Sunday morning at 9:30 and you walk into the Chapel, you'll be treated to a beautiful sight: dozens of little kids from ages three through nine singing, dancing and sharing their thoughts about life, God and our planet. This is our TIR Tefilah for our younger grades and it is awesome. Quite a few parents stick around to join us and it has, in essence, become a family worship experience.

While I love it and will expand it further as our children continue to learn and grow their Jewish minds, I am positive that this energy shouldn't be relegated to Sunday mornings. It should infiltrate our Friday evenings and spread its joy to all of our members. What could be more satisfying than seeing the future of our Temple and the Jewish people become "regulars" in the Sanctuary and join their voices with ours?



To make that happen, we have to embrace change. I realize that, for some, change is welcome and refreshing. For others, however, it brings challenges. Change is never easy and I know that we, as a community, face big changes ahead as we launch a search for our new Rabbi.

It is said that "the secret of change is to focus all of your energy, not on fighting the old, but on building the new." In that vein, Michelle Penson and I have been planning to meld our Sunday morning "congregation" with our congregation at large and create a first Friday experience that is inclusive of our entire community from our youngest to eldest members.

Shabbat Shireinu (the first of which was Friday, February 7th) will be the new name for our first Friday services. As "Shireinu" means "our songs," our service will be full of music, some of which will be led by the students of TIR. JAFTY will continue to participate and help to inspire our children to engage in Jewish life as they grow older. In other congregations that I have been privileged to serve, we have used the first Friday of the month to bring the entire community together. It is when families with younger children can come knowing that spoken messages will be shorter and that we are striving to engage everyone in the room regardless of age...or the ability to sit completely still. We have used it as an opportunity to celebrate the birthdays and anniversaries for the month that has just begun. And, more often than not, this service is at an earlier time than those of the rest of the month. We will be implementing these changes as Shabbat Shireinu becomes a part of our regular worship, so please stay tuned to your Temple Times emails for details over the next few months.

It is our hope that, if you are available, you will come join us for this uplifting Shabbat, the next of which will be March 6. There will be a little nosh beforehand and a very special oneg afterward. If you are a TIR family who doesn't usually come to services you should know that we are all excited to see you! If you are a regular attendee, please come ready to welcome the little people among us. And to everyone: bring a friend with you. Let's show our children how powerful it is to be in a room full of joyous song and how easy it can be to fill each other's hearts with joy.

Happy (Secular) New Year to all of you. I look forward to sharing 2020 with you and your families as we go from strength to strength together.






