In the Hebrew Bible, God often works through acts that are clearly read as divine intervention such as flooding the world during the time of Noah, raining plagues upon Egypt, parting the Sea of Reeds, or opening up the earth to swallow rebelling tribesmen. As modern people, we have adjusted our understanding of natural disasters so that we no longer see them as divine retribution for sin, but as people of faith, we remain certain that God has a metaphorical hand in human life.

As we emerge from our "pandemic pods" and begin to reintegrate (while continuing to remain vigilant!), I've been contemplating the development of the vaccine for COVID-19. Built upon years of research with other corona viruses and combined with new methods, our scientists truly brought the world a modern miracle befitting the ancient gods of myth and legend. I keep thinking about this old joke:

Soon the water rose above the rooftop and the man drowned. He went to Heaven. He finally got his chance to discuss this whole situation with God, at which point he exclaimed, "I had faith in you but you didn't save me, you let me drown. I don't understand why!" To this God replied, "I sent you a rowboat, a motorboat and a helicopter, what more did you expect?"

Deus ex machina, literally "god from the machine," is the literary term for a person or thing that appears into a situation suddenly to provide a solution to an apparently unsolvable situation. In the joke, the stranded man is waiting for God to arrive, so he ignores all of God's veiled attempts to intercede.

Here, in the 21st century, if we heard a voice from a burning bush, we'd be more likely to check ourselves into a hospital than to follow its directions. It has long been my belief that we find God, instead, in the inspired actions of others, "the helpers," if you will. God acts through scientific breakthroughs, fighters for social justice, and all others who heed the call to acts of gemilut chasadim: feeding the hungry, healing the sick, clothing the naked, freeing the captive and lifting up the fallen.

As we receive our vaccinations, let us thank our scientists and medical professionals for working to keep us alive, but let us also take a moment to praise God, the One who blesses us with wisdom and ingenuity, and the free will to use those powers to help our fellow man.

A new day is dawning at The Temple. In just two months, we will welcome Rabbi Maya Glasser to lead our congregation toward a new, bright future.

As we prepare for our Rabbi's arrival, we move forward with plans to make this a more welcoming and inclusive congregation. We are gathering information to know our congregants better, improve communications, and make us financially sound. This letter reviews areas of interest to all of us. Please know you can call with questions.

MEMBER CENSUS: The primary reason we switched our membership management software to ShulCloud is its ability to update and organize data in a more useful manner. You can log in to your account to update many of the fields and we can also help you. We'd like to know more about you, our members. By



knowing your interests, skills, profession, hobby, etc., we may be able to assist you -- or ask for your assistance. I encourage you to share as much information as you feel comfortable. A Member Census Form will be mailed to you shortly. Please complete the form promptly and return it in the envelope provided. We need your immediate help to avoid a second mailing and follow-up phone calls.

SHULCLOUD: (our new computer program) has changed how we communicate and operate. To date, you have been able to log on to obtain easy-to-understand statements, view information about your account and make changes to some of the information on hand. In the next few weeks, you'll start receiving e-mailed monthly account statements, along with "thank you" notes acknowledging contributions and dues payments, all from ShulCloud. Yahrzeit notices will be sent promptly and give you the opportunity to easily make a contribution honoring your departed loved one right from your computer. If you don't receive e-mail, the system will generate paper copies to be delivered to you by USPS mail.

ANNUAL PLEDGE: In June, you will receive your 2021-22 Annual Pledge form. This vital document enables us to plan how we will operate during the year ahead. Please save us time and money by completing and returning the form promptly. Instructions will accompany the mailing and your questions are welcome. Please remember the completed form is kept confidential and it helps us to accurately set up our billing. The system will not indicate a past due balance if your account is set in advance to receive annual, semi-annual, quarterly and monthly payments. As in the past, you'll be able to pay by cash, check, credit card and now ACH transfers. Please watch for more to come.

<u>VOLUNTEERS:</u> We're looking for volunteers. Do you have time to be actively involved with the day-to-day affairs of Temple? If yes, we welcome your talents and appreciate the help you can provide to our office staff! Training will be provided. Call and we'll discuss the opportunities further (904-733-7078). Volunteer opportunities include:

Biblical Garden

Plans have been approved and construction is well underway on The Temple's Biblical Garden. Located to the left of our front door, as you enter the building, the garden will feature eleven (11) varieties of plants, all found in the Tenach and important in sustaining the lives of our ancestors in the Middle East.

The project has been designed by Reverend Dr. Ed Bez, President of the Biblical Gardens Society – USA, who is also providing construction supervision. Funding of the garden is provided by the Dr. Larry & Kathy Kanter Jewish Preservation Fund and Temple members. The garden will be cared for by our congregants.





The garden's most prominent feature is a Date Palm, planted to honor Goldie Lansky's 12 years of dedicated service to Congregation Ahavath Chesed as our Executive Director. The Palm is symbolic of the peace and plenty, grace and elegance Goldie brought to our Temple family.

Work on the garden started with the leveling of land and the removal of tree stumps. Then, on a rainy day in January, an olive tree (*Oleo Europaea L.*) was planted. The olive tree is an important Middle East fruit tree and is the national tree of Israel.

On March 17, David Kaufman (Temple President), Dr. Larry Kanter and Reverend Dr. Bez led a program with friends, members and guests attending the dedication of the Date Palm tree. Just 3 days later, March 20, the Congregation participated in the garden's formal dedication, followed immediately by an outdoor Havdalah service.

Dr. Bez views the garden as; "Fostering a feeling of connection with both the natural and biblical worlds is one of my primary goals in the development phase of The Temple's Bible garden project." "Anyone who has ever spent time tilling the soil, nurturing seeds and watching them bloom recognizes there is a very spiritual side to gardening - a deep communion with God that happens when we help nature flourish. The Bible Garden at Congregation Ahavath Chesed is an inspirational undertaking to enrich the spiritual lives of our members."

This garden and one under construction at nearby Christ the Messiah Church are the only biblical gardens on the First Coast. The gardens, designed to complement each other, will stand as commitments to interfaith cooperation and understanding.
